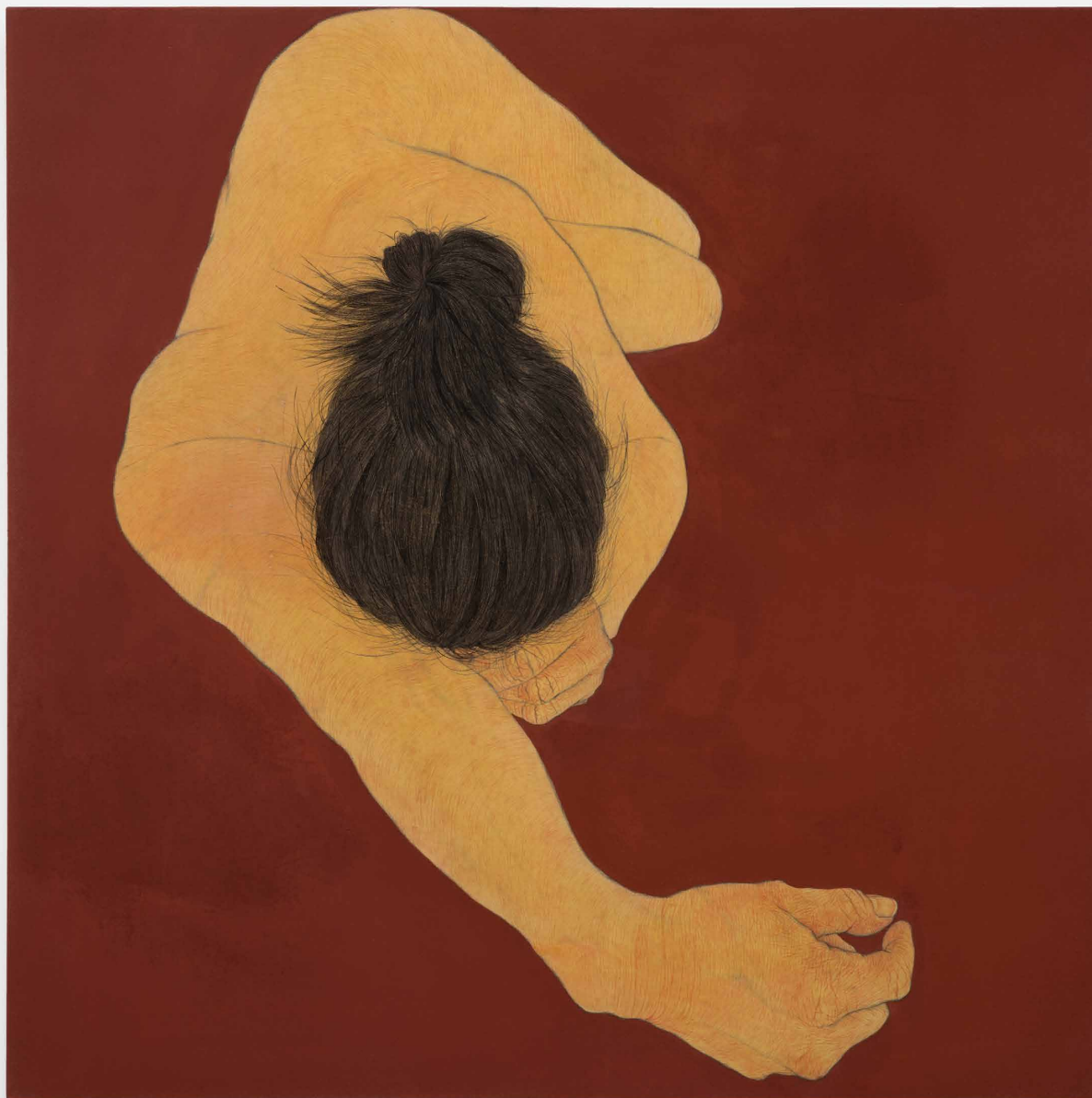
VIAN SORA

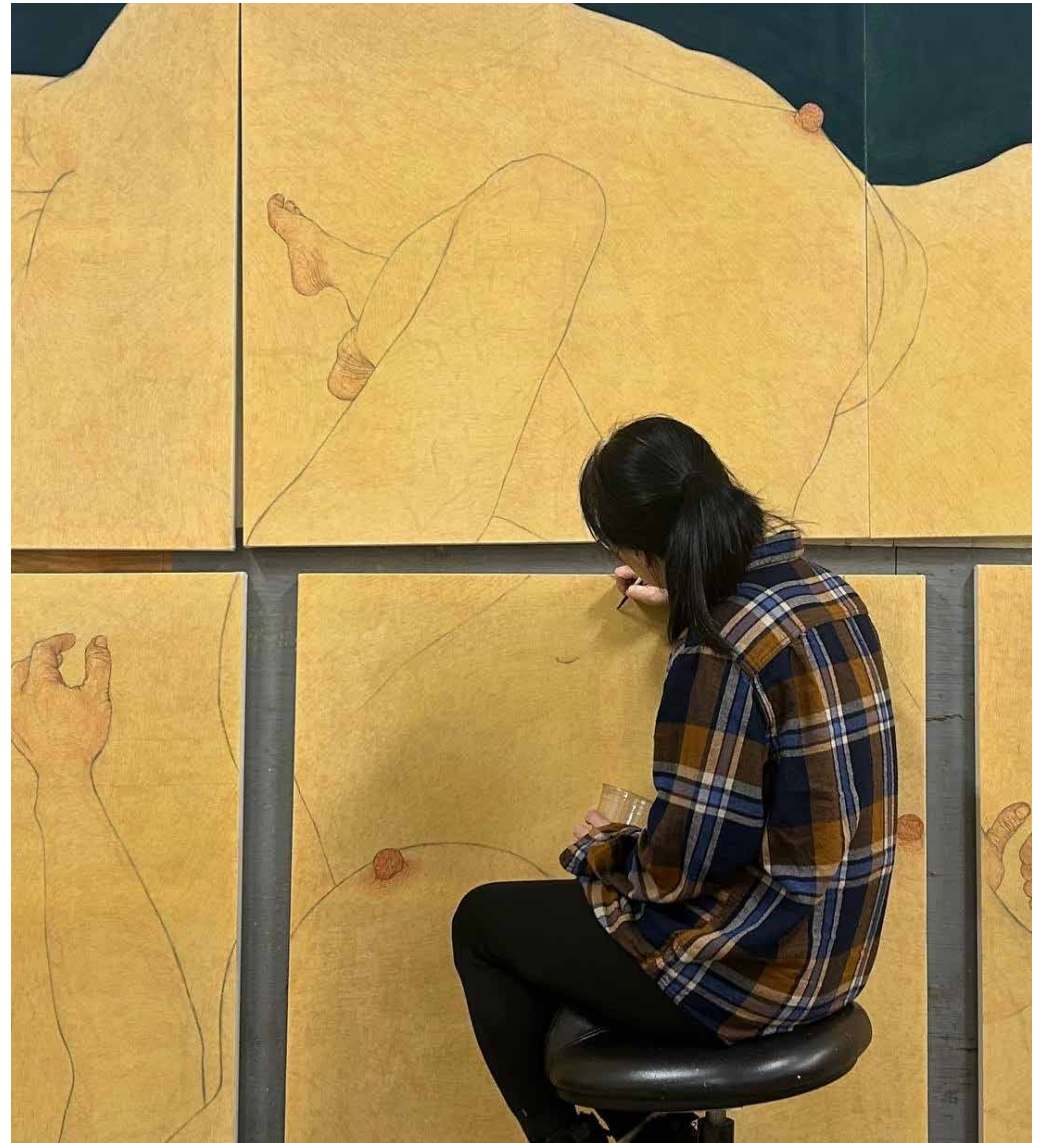

YAYOI KUSAMA

Yayoi Kusama (b. 1929 in Motsumoto, Nagano, Japan lives and works in Tokyo, Japan) has been the subject of both solo and group presentations worldwide. Her work has transcended two of the most important art movements of the second half of the twentieth century: pop art and minimalism. Her highly influential career encompasses paintings, performances, room-size presentations, outdoor sculptural installations, literary works, films, fashion, design, and interventions within existing architectural structures, which allude at once to microscopic and macroscopic universes.

Kusama's work is held in museum collections worldwide, including the Art Gallery of Ontario, Toronto; Centre Pompidou, Paris; Hirshhorn Museum and Sculpture Garden, Washington, DC; Los Angeles County Museum of Art; The Museum of Modern Art, New York; National Museum of Modern Art, Tokyo; Stedelijk Museum, Amsterdam; Tate, United Kingdom; Walker Art Center, Minneapolis, Minnesota; and the Whitney Museum of American Art, New York, among numerous others.

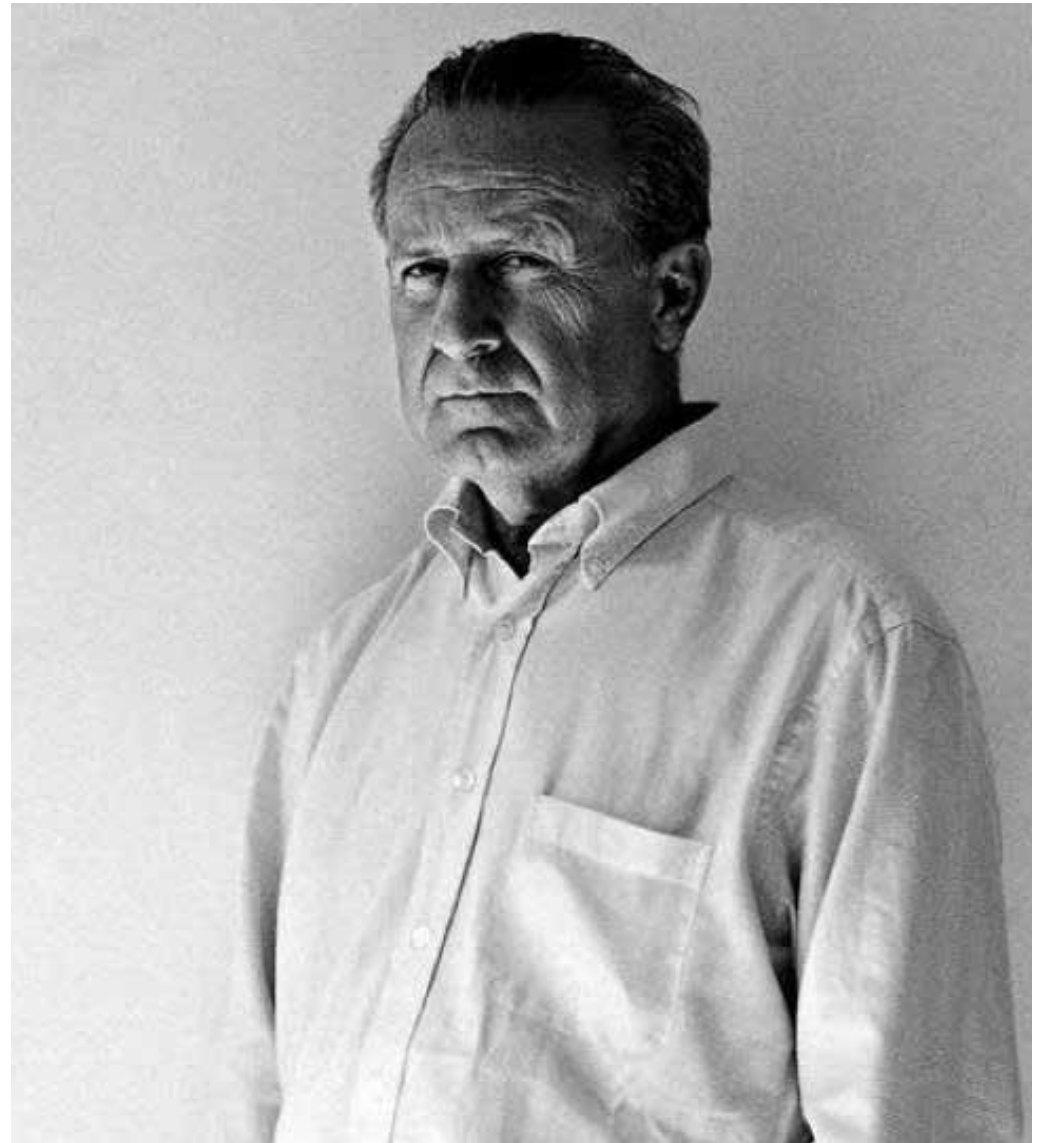


CLAUDIO PARMIGGIANI

Claudio Parmiggiani (b. 1943, Luzzara, Italy; lives and works in Parma, Italy) began making smoke-and-soot compositions, which he calls *delocazione* (or “de-located” artworks), in 1970.

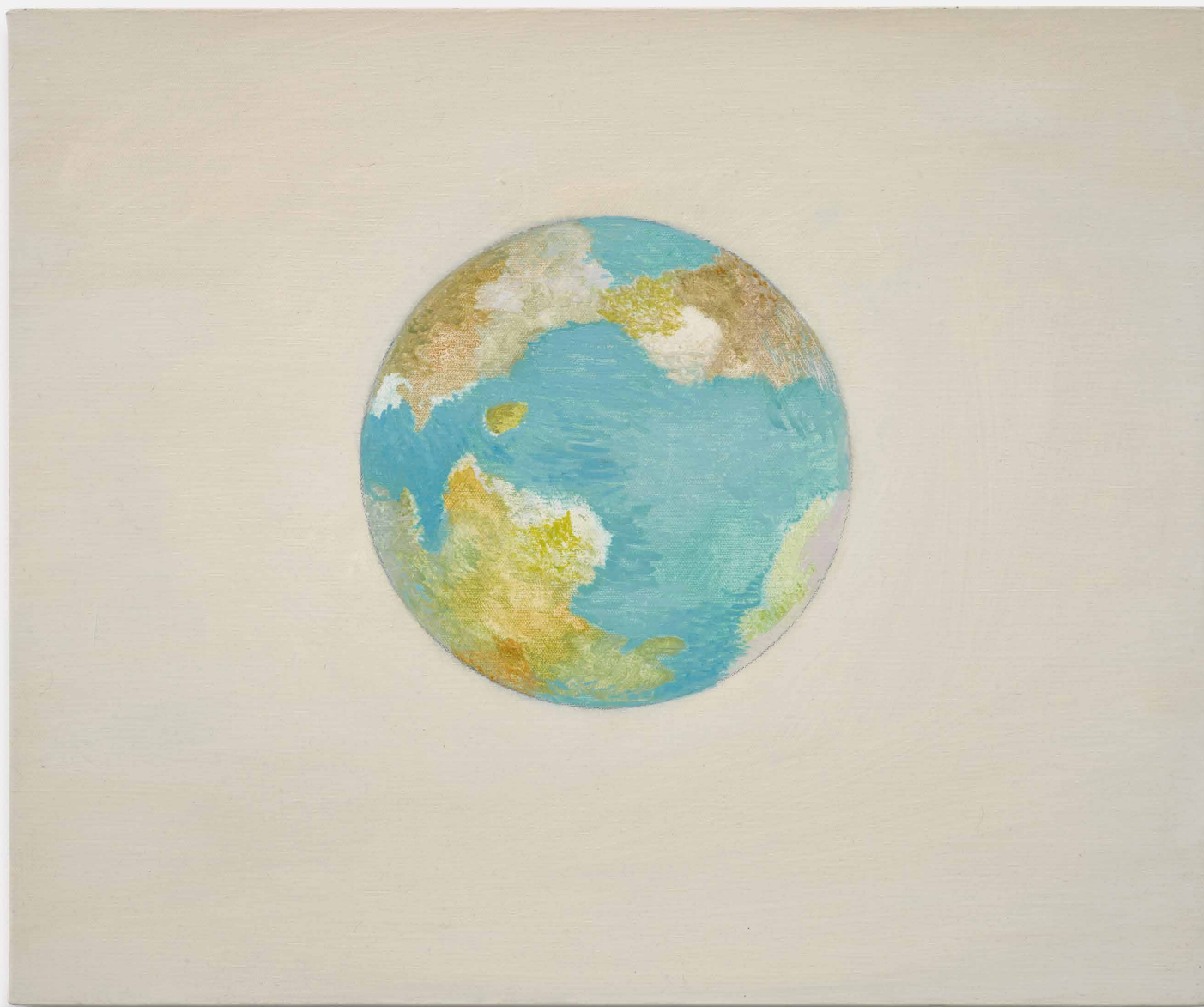

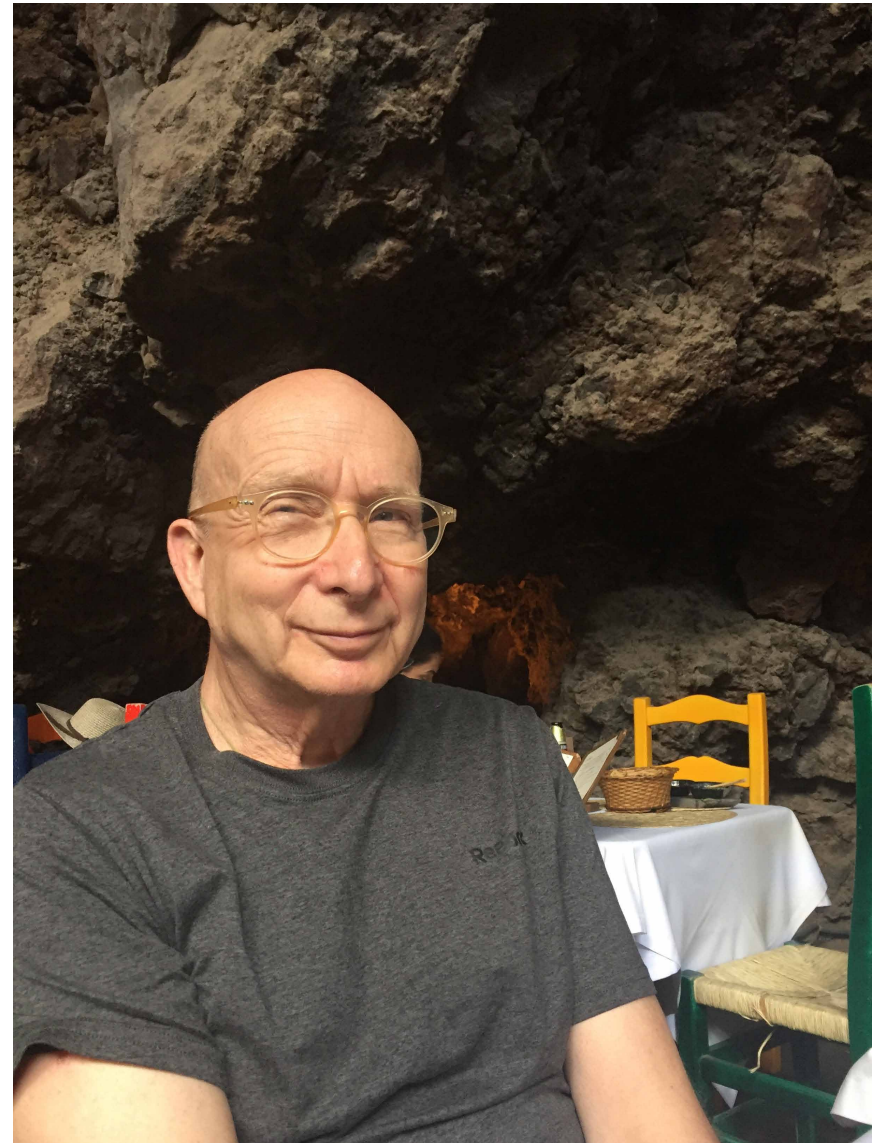


ROBERT BORDO

Robert Bordo (b. 1949 in Montreal, Québec, Canada; lives and works in New York, USA) integrates abstract painting language with themes and metaphors that reflect his interest in landscape, modernist painting, and memory. He was an Associate Professor of Art at The Cooper Union, New York, where he led the painting program from 1996 until 2017.

Recent solo and two person exhibitions include Foreland, Catskill, NY, and Bortolami, New York, NY. His paintings have been featured in exhibitions at MoMA PS1; the Brooklyn Museum; the Sheldon Museum of Art, Omaha; the Museum für Gegenwartskunst in Basel; Artists Space, New York; the Tel Aviv Museum of Art; Casa Roberto Marinho, Rio de Janeiro; and the Drawing Center. Bordo's work is currently on view in the group exhibition a field full of bloom and hum at the Tang Teaching Museum & Art Gallery, Skidmore College.

His work is held in the collections of SFMoMA, the Metropolitan Museum of Art, the Hammer Museum, and the Blanton Museum of Art among others. Bordo has been the recipient of many prestigious awards, fellowships, and residencies including PRAKSIS Oslo, the Robert de Niro Sr. Painting Prize, the Solomon R. Guggenheim Foundation Fellowship, Canada Council Arts Grants, the Tesuque Foundation Arts Fellowship Award, a MacDowell Colony Fellowship, and a Painting Fellowship from the New York Foundation for the Arts.

Cole Lu (b. 1984, Taipei, Taiwan; lives and works in New York) combines literary and historical reference with autobiographical experiences to build mythologies that carry echoes of trauma, transformation, and regeneration.

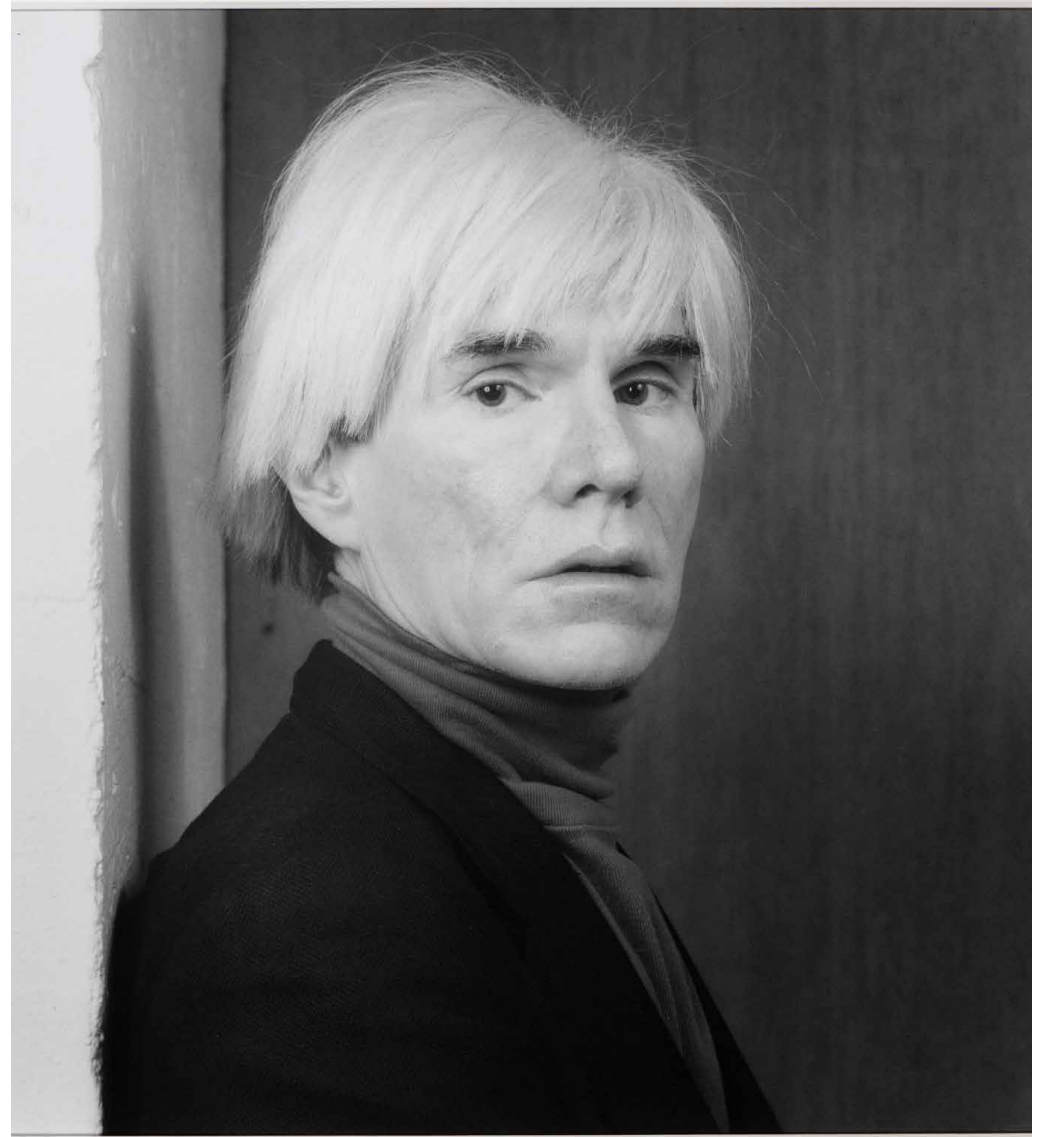

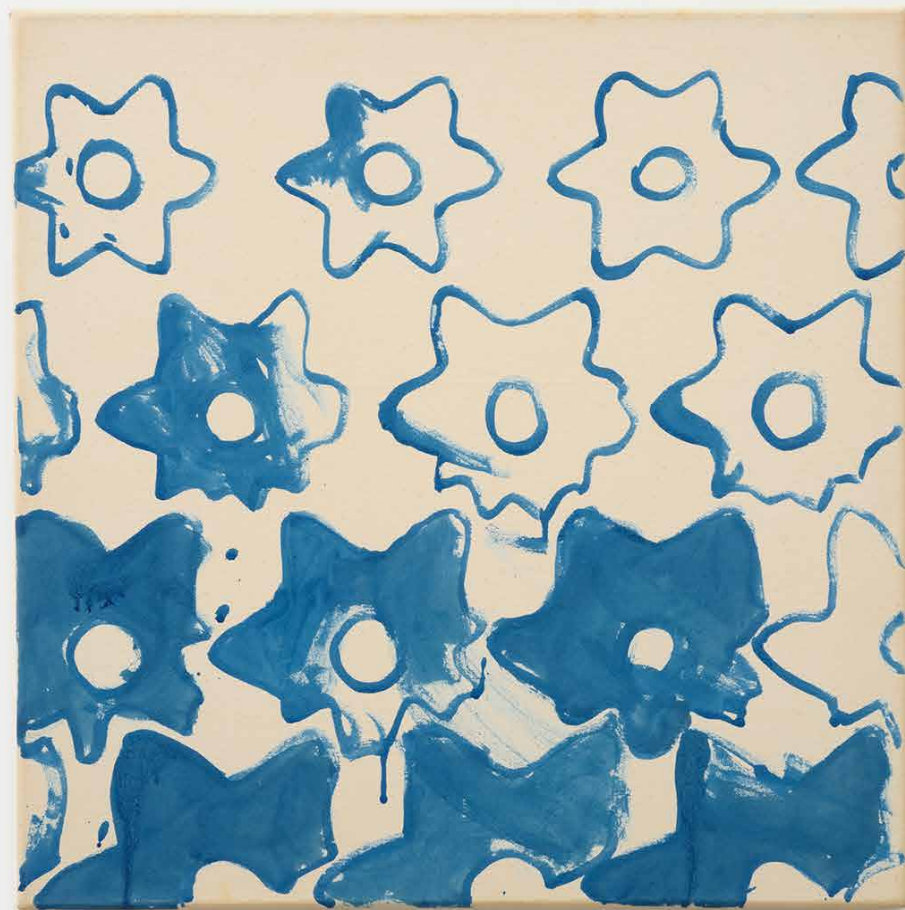

ANDY WARHOL

Andy Warhol (b. 1928, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, USA; d. 1987 lived and worked in New York) earned his BFA from the Carnegie Institute of Technology in 1949. Early in his career, he was a successful commercial artist and illustrator, and his work was published in magazines and a variety of print media. In the 1960s, he helped launch the Pop Art movement. His works explore the relationship between artistic expression, advertising, and celebrity culture that had flourished by the 1960s, and span a variety of media, including painting, sculpture, photography, and filmmaking. He is considered by many to be one of the most influential artists of the late 20th century.

MICHEL MAJERUS

Michel Majerus (b. 1967, Luxembourg, d. 2002; lived and worked in Berlin, Germany) had a brief but prolific career before tragically dying in a plane crash. His synthesis of painting with early digital media and advertising had left an indelible influence on contemporary painting.

Posthumous museum solo exhibitions include those at MUDAM, Luxembourg; KW Institute for Contemporary Art, Berlin, Germany; Sprengel Museum, Hanover, Germany; CAPC Musée d'art contemporain de Bordeaux, Bordeaux, France; Kunsthaus Graz, Austria; Kunstmuseum Stuttgart, Germany; Stedelijk Museum, Amsterdam, the Netherlands; Hamburger Bahnhof – Museum für Gegenwart, Berlin, Germany; Tate Liverpool, United Kingdom. During his life, Majerus had a one-person exhibition at the Kunsthalle Baselland at the 1999 Venice Biennale he created a mural that covered the facade of the Main Pavilion.

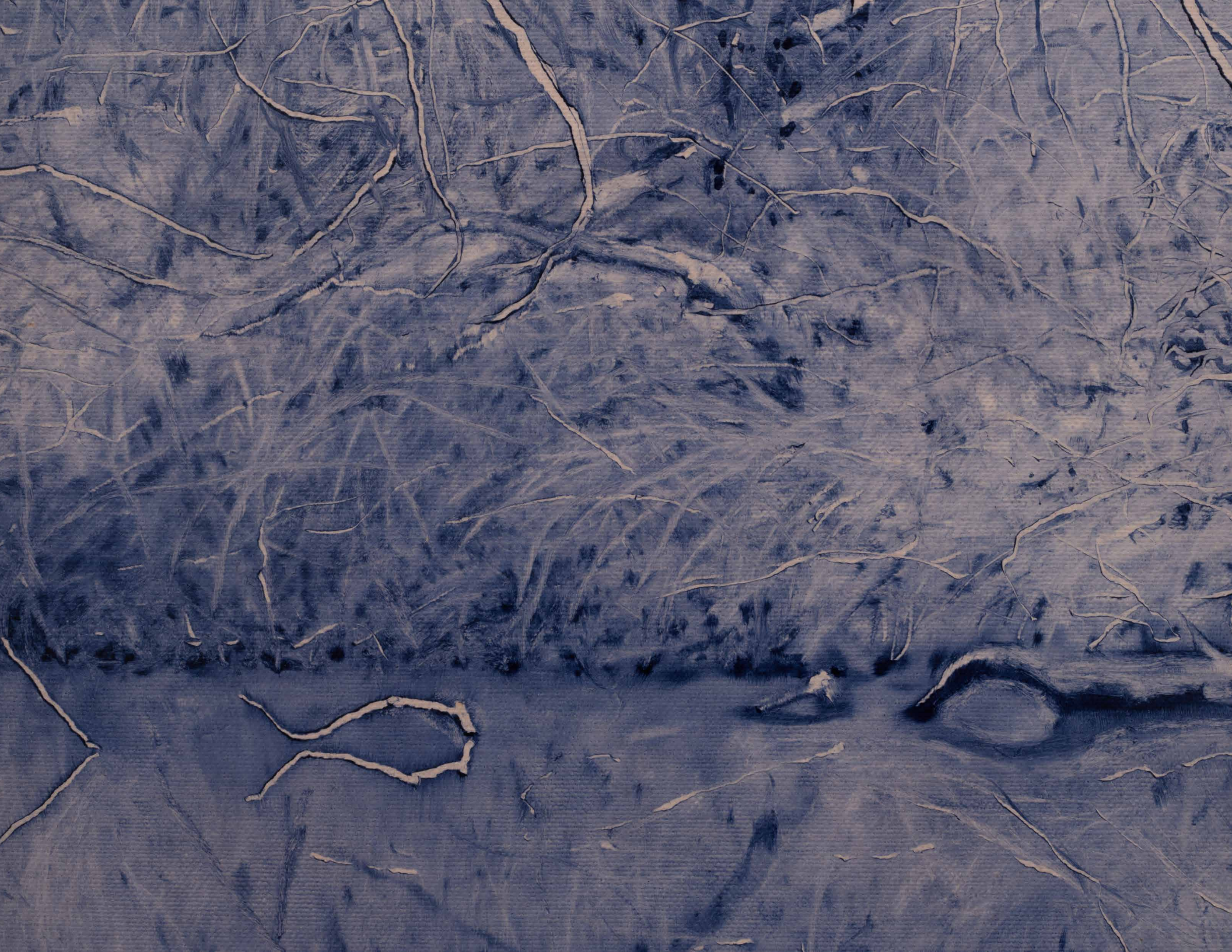
